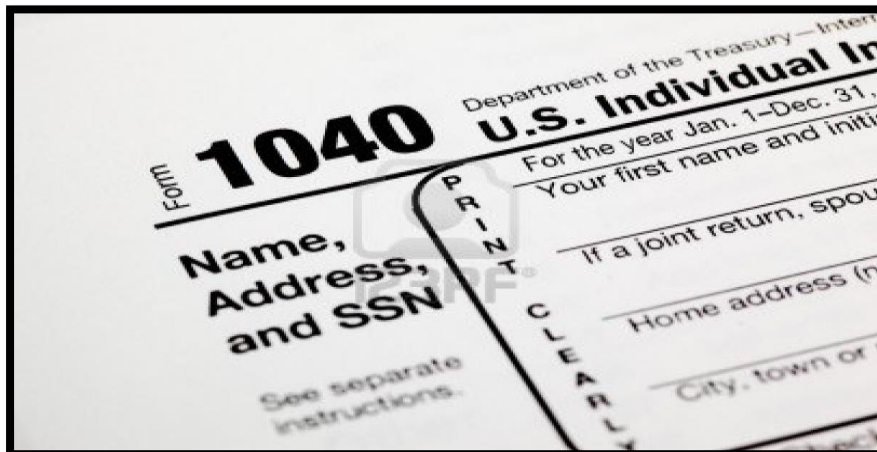

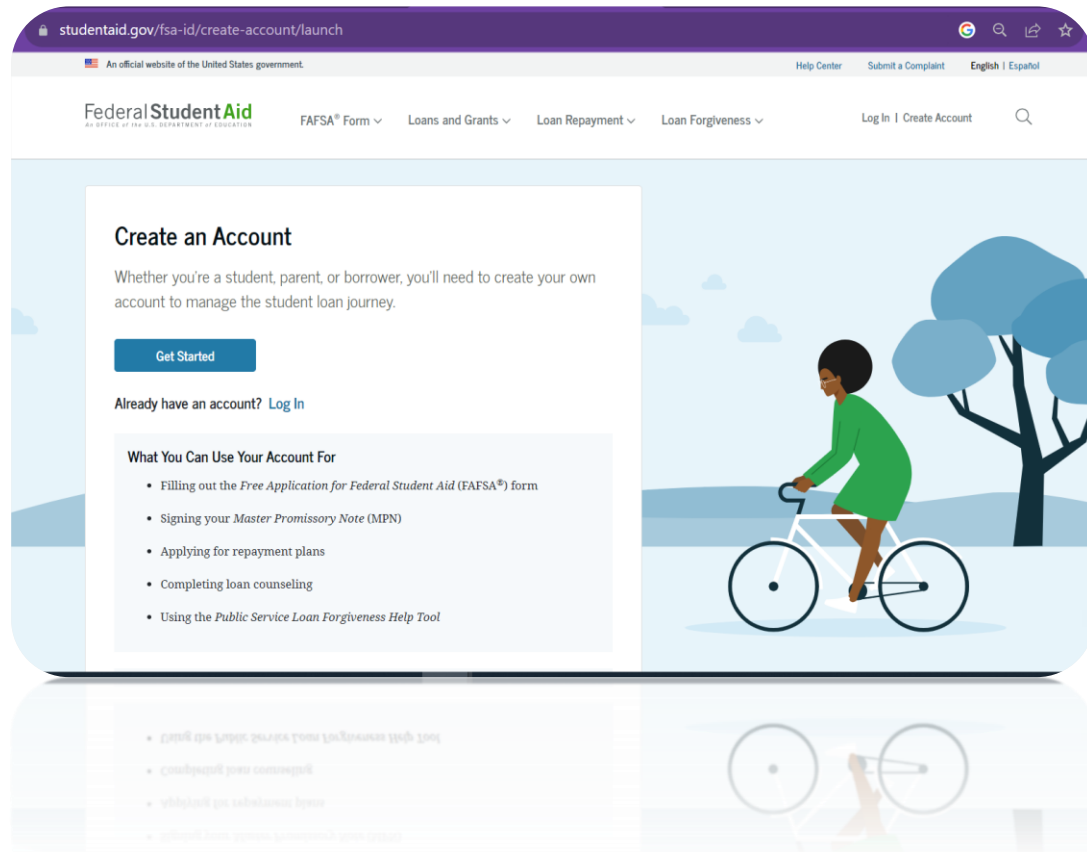

Summary

Your consent is needed to retrieve and disclose federal tax information (FTI). With your consent, we can obtain tax return information automatically from the IRS to help you complete the FAFSA[®] form. If you don't provide consent, you will not be eligible for federal student aid, including grants and loans. You must provide consent even if you didn't file a U.S. federal tax return or any tax return at all.

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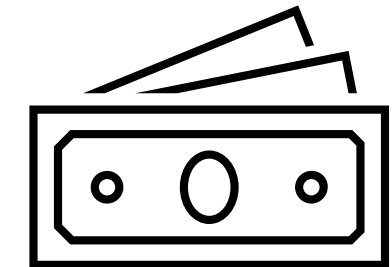
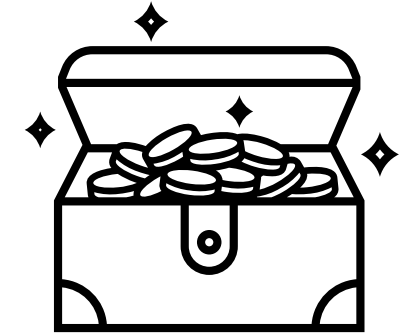
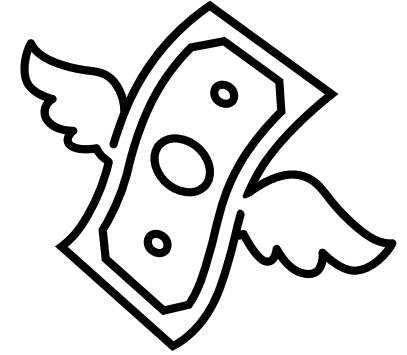

Complete Your Student Loan Entrance Counseling Requirement

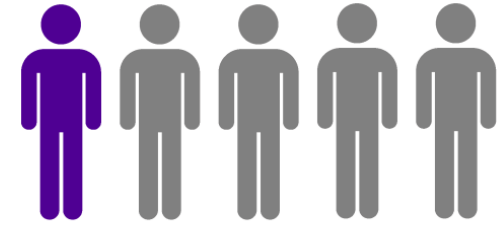

WHAT IS THE PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP

- A last dollar scholarship designed to provide unparalleled access to higher education
- The goal is to increase the number of students in our community earning a postsecondary credential
- Promise covers the full cost of in-district tuition and books
- Promise is designed to support students through an associates degree or certificate
- It is available to ALL graduating seniors in our community



Only **1 in 5** students in Harris County earn a postsecondary credential.

60 x 30

By **2030**, Texas aims to have **60%** of the workforce holding a postsecondary credential.

WHAT DOES IT COVER?

- All in-district tuition which is \$83 per credit hour (students must be enrolled in at least **12** credit hours)
 - * **Exceptions can be made in student's final semester or extenuating circumstances with the approval of a Promise Coordinator**
- Books and supplies up to \$600 per semester
- Dedicated Promise team

WHAT DOES IT COVER?

- Promise is designed to support students up to 3 years, the students first associates degree or the first 72 college credit hours earned, whichever one comes first
 - Selected non- credit certifications such as:
 - Certified Nurse Aide
 - Professional Truck Driver- CDL
 - Phlebotomy Certification, etc.
- * Students may not concurrently use Promise funds for both credit and non-credit programs within a semester
